Prologue- before the word Before the main event

Introduces main characters, themes, story or setting. Establishes the tone for the play or piece of literature

Doesn't just set the scene but it also gives us reasons to Praise!!

Author: John the Disciple

- A fisherman, son of Zebedee, brother of James
- 'Son of Thunder' who became the 'Apostle of love'
- Included in Jesus' inner three (despite probably being the youngest apostle) and the one who was entrusted with caring for Jesus' mother Mary.
- Theological and missiological biography rather than chronological emphasis
- Who Jesus is as a focus rather than what Jesus did
- John 20:31 But these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.
- Probably 'published' in Ephesus after John's exile on Patmos (96AD) and finished before his death around 99AD

Logos- Word

- The reason and mind of God (Greek)
 - Heraclitus 560BC 'Is there any meaning or purpose or pattern in life?' Logos was the answer
- The powerful speech of God (Hebrew)
 - Creative and communicative word of YHWH
 - The communicating link between God and humanity
